COMBAT AUTO THEFT (C.A.T.)

By displaying the C.A.T. Decal, the vehicle owner gives law enforcement officers permission to do an investigative stop of the vehicle, during the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m., to determine if the vehicle has been stolen.
