Insights from Your Support Team

"See something, say something"

A neighborhood watch program cannot work without the support of all local residents. Most importantly, all involved need to live by the "See something, Say something" motto.

Whether it is a vehicle that you don't recognize that lingers a little too long or someone that seems to be watching your neighbor's home, don't be afraid to speak up. Living by the "See something, Say something" motto does not mean running to dial 911. Our Charlotte County Sheriff's Office has a non-emergency number. It is 941-639-2101; don't be afraid to use it. Please remember that anytime you see something that is life threatening in any way, an accident with injuries, a house fire, etc, you still need to dial 911. Pretty much anything else can be handled through the non-emergency number. But, whether you dial 911 or 941-639-2101, be sure that you have a description, a location and a time before you call. Details are very important.

Finally, please understand that "See something, Say something" is not about profiling a person or situation. It is about being aware of your surroundings and reporting anything that causes you concern. Something that makes you go hmm?!

And consider sharing this information with your neighbors and friends. Do they even know that Neighborhood Watch exists? Talk about it with them. Let them know who we are and what we do. Our organization can always use new blood. Maybe they want to drive for 2 hours a month or sit at home and be a base, but either way let them know that they are needed.

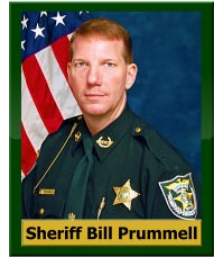
